Recently awarded the most visited tourist attraction in Ireland for 2019 with over 1.7m visitors last year, the Guinness Storehouse is a must for those visiting Dublin. Located in the heart of the legendary St. James' Gate Brewery in Dublin, this production site has been home to Guinness since 1759, when Arthur Guinness signed the now famous 9,000-year lease on the brewery. Guinness Storehouse was the former fermentation plant and has now been re-modelled into a visiting centre for tourists.

The highlight for many visitors is the highest point of the building – The Gravity Bar. The Gravity Bar has fantastic views of Dublin City and is where visitors can sit and relax over a perfectly poured pint of "The Black Stuff".

Kilmainham Gaol (Jail) is a former prison and is now converted into a museum. Kilmainham Gaol played an important part in Irish history, as many leaders of Irish rebellions were imprisoned and some executed in the prison by the British, most notably the leaders of the unsuccessful Easter Rising 1916. It is one of the largest unoccupied jails in Europe and is one of the most popular tourist spots in Dublin.

Attractions include a major exhibition detailing the political and penal history of the prison and its restoration. The tour of the prison includes an audio-visual show. Tours may be arranged for visitors with special needs by prior arrangement.

The West County Hotel is situated next door to Europe's largest public park, The Phoenix Park. The Phoenix Park is 1752 acres of historic landscape and was originally conceived as a royal deer park. A herd of Fallow Deer has lived in the park since along with a wide range of other wildlife mammals and birds.

Áras an Uachtaráin, the residence of the President of Ireland dates from 1750 and is located in the centre of the park adjacent to the United States Ambassador's residence, which was built in 1774. Many other historic buildings and monuments are located in the Park, including The Papal Cross which was erected for the visit of Pope John Paul II on 29th September 1979. Over one million people attended an open-air mass at the time. The park is open every day of the year.

Temple Bar is the historic heart of Dublin, full to the brim with arts, culture and creativity. Located in the very heart of Dublin city center, Temple Bar is situated between Westmoreland Street and Christchurch. Providing a cultural hotspot during the day, Temple Bar has a lively nightlife popular among tourists looking to sample the famous "craic" among the Irish people.

There's something for everyone: outdoor markets, exhibitions (e.g. the Irish Photography Centre, Temple Bar Gallery and Studios), music, buskers, theatre, galleries, cafés, fine restaurants, magicians, beautiful architecture, ancient cobbles, Viking history and even more. Part of the old city walls dating back to 12th century Dublin can be seen within Temple Bar.

There are more than 70 specially commissioned works of public art located throughout Temple Bar. The Temple Bar Cultural Trust is open Mon-Fri 9.00am to 5.30pm and admission is free.

The City of Dublin can trace its origin back more than 1,000 years from when the Vikings settled in the area known as Duiblinn (or Black Pool). Here at Dublinia, you get to learn about life back in the Viking and the medieval period in Dublin.

Go back in time and learn all about Viking times in Dublin. See artefacts and weapons, try on Viking clothing and walk among a Viking street as you learn all the interesting aspects of Viking culture. Then move on to the middle ages, and learn all about crime, warfare and disease of medieval Dublin as these two exhibitions are brought to life right in front of you.

The last part of the tour takes you into the life of archaeology as you learn in depth how science allows us to piece parts of history together. Courtesy of the National Museum of Ireland, see genuine Viking and Medieval artefacts including the skeletal remains of a Viking warrior and a medieval woman, both found in Dublin.

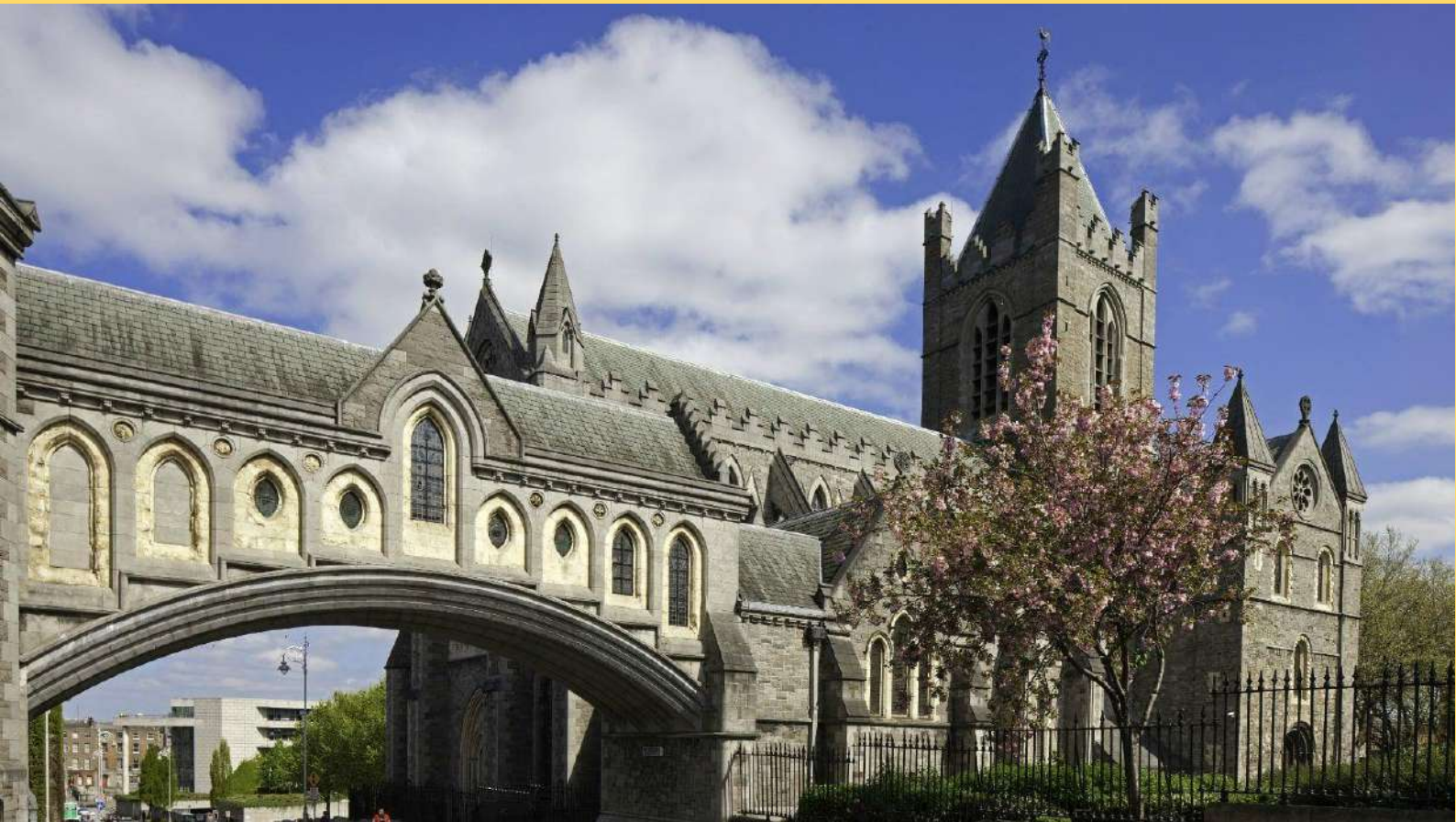

Christ Church Cathedral was founded almost 1,000 years ago and is one of the top visitor attractions in Dublin. Visitors can enjoy and view the beautiful interior of the Cathedral and witness the wide range of important collection of relics within the cathedral, including a miraculous speaking cross and a piece from the crib of Jesus.

Christ Church Cathedral also includes the medieval crypt, an underground tomb thought to be the oldest working structure in Dublin. Here you will find the cathedral's own copy of the Magna Carta on display, along with 'the Cat & the Rat' – two mummified animals.

Guided tours for the cathedral now include the chance to visit the belfry and ring the bells of Christ Church Cathedral yourself.

Marsh's Library is situated right beside St. Patrick's Cathedral and is home to over 25,000 rare and fascinating books and manuscripts. The library allows the guest to step back into the eighteenth century, due to its largely unchanged interior since its founding in 1707. Visitors from all over the world come to admire the architecture and soak up the atmosphere.

Marsh's Library is one of the very few 18th century buildings left in Dublin that is still being used for its original purpose. The library contains two galleries joined together by a small reading room. The First Gallery houses 10,000 books in a wide range of areas, including history, law, politics, classical studies and science. The Second Gallery contains Archbishop Narcissus Marsh's personal collection of books and also features lockable cages used once upon a time to prevent readers stealing books. Previous visitors to the library for research include Bram Stoker and James Joyce.

The National Museum of Ireland – Decorative Arts and History is one of four sites under the National Museum umbrella. The museum is home to a wide range of objects and artefacts including weaponry, furniture, silver, ceramics, glassware, Asian art and the Asgard, as well as folk life and costume artefacts.

The museum hosts a number of exhibitions throughout the year. These exhibitions change consistently, and it is recommended to visit the museum's website to see what exhibitions are currently on show. 2020 has seen a number of wonderful exhibitions, including "Irish Wars 1919 to 1923". Built in the 13th Century, Dublin Castle is situated at the heart of Dublin City. Steeped in history, Dublin Castle was the seat of English and British rule in Ireland until 1922, when the last ever Viceroy of Ireland handed Dublin Castle over to the new Irish State following the War of Independence. Since that historic moment, Dublin Castle has continued to host important national events, such as state dinners and commemorations.

Dublin Castle features both the Garda and Revenue museums, Government Buildings, State Apartments, Chester Beatty Library and the Chapel Royal. Guided Tours of the castle are available daily, with experienced guides giving the complete walkthrough of Dublin Castle. Guided Tours include a visit down to the Viking Excavation, allowing you to explore parts of the original castle structure and its defensive walls built by the Vikings in the 12th century.
